LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

We've just started the primary season, and you can tell things are going to move fast! Iowa's record turnout for a Republican caucus shows that Republicans are serious about turning this country around. One thing that unites us is our respect for our military men and women and their families. We want to be sure that they are not forgotten. The VA scandal that topped the headlines for so long in 2014 still looms over our heads. In April 2015, Senator Marco Rubio introduced the VA Accountability Act in the Senate (S 1082). The bipartisan bill would allow the Secretary of the Department of Veterans' Affairs to remove or demote a VA employee because of poor performance or misconduct. In July 2015, the House passed its own version of the bill and sent that to the Senate (H.R. 1994). The House passing was met with an immediate veto threat from the President. In October 2015, Sen. Rubio called for an immediate vote on the bill, but Sen. Richard Blumenthal (D.Conn.) blocked this action. Since that time, the VA Accountability Act has been stuck in limbo. The time for action is now!

Here's what we have been asked to do by a number of our members, veterans, and related entities: PLEASE CALL YOUR SENATORS AND TELL THEM HOW YOU FEEL ABOUT THE VA ACCOUNTABILITY ACT. You can ask that the Senate call the bill for a vote or send it to a Conference Committee to iron out the differences between the Senate and House versions. But, please make it clear that DOING NOTHING IS UNACCEPTABLE. Our veterans deserve better.

Contact information is provided below. There is also a link that allows you to see the language of the two bills as passed by the House and as proposed by the Senate. There are also numerous articles about the bill if you'd like to do further research yourself. Let's show our veterans that we support them. Call your Senators today!

Recording Your Volunteer Campaign Hours!

Did you know the time **you** volunteer each quarter to help Republicans get elected are reported to the Texas Federation of Republican Women [TFRW] quarterly? That means hours volunteered by ARW members to the Republican Party of Texas and the Travis County Republican Party at state, local and national levels.

Types of Campaign Activities include ARW or political fundraisers, Get Out the Vote, work during the elections, time spent at home doing mailings/phoning/clerical, planning and conducting certain political workshops, travel to ARW/TFRW/NFRW meetings, organizational work, volunteering for a Republican candidate, running for office, presenting political speeches at civic clubs, serving as a precinct chair, and work at political conventions. It even includes cooking for political events!

Who is eligible to report volunteer hours? You are if the time volunteered is a campaign activity as defined above. For clarification, male associate members report their hours to their wife's PRIMARY club [this is when she may belong to more than one club and is a candidate or elected official]. She will report her hours to her PRIMARY club also.

This is an exciting year with the flurry of activities surrounding the election of a new president of the United States. There are many opportunities for volunteering in that election as well as many local and state races. I suggest you keep a calendar of your hours volunteered each month along with identification of where/what you did and email them to me per the instructions below.

Grand New Party

It began in a little schoolhouse in Ripon, Wisconsin, in **1854**. A small group of dedicated abolitionists gathered to fight the expansion of slavery, and they gave birth to a Party dedicated to freedom and equal opportunity.

The name “Republican” was chosen, alluding to Thomas Jefferson’s Democratic-Republican Party and conveying a commitment to the inalienable rights of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

The Party was formally organized in July 1854 by thousands of anti-slavery activists at a convention in Jackson, Michigan. And it was no accident that two years later, in **1856**, the first Republican National Convention took place in Philadelphia, where the Constitution was written. From: <https://www.gop.com/history/>
