October 30 is the last day for early voting for the Texas Constitutional Amendments with Nov 3 the final election date. There are some important issues at stake, and I want to encourage everyone to vote. It is especially important because there has been a great deal of misinformation going around especially regarding propositions 2 & 3. I have sent out several e-mails from different reliable sources with recommendations for these amendments. each of these sources have strongly agreed on voting yes for 2, 3, 5 & 11.. If anyone needs them resent, please let me know. Take the time to read each proposition. One should always be well informed on issues and then vote...if only our members in Congress had the opportunity and time to do the same.

Thank you all for your hard work in contacting US Senators regarding the Baucus "OBAMACARE" Bill. Our work isn't over. Let's keep it up. Susan Dinges Burak has an article in our Legislative section.along with key Senators to contact. In addition, we must not forget that Cap and Tax/Trade is still out there. While you are contacting Legislators about Health Care, please let them know that you are also opposed to this new tax scheme that will hurt all of us as well. I have sent the contact information for the Blue Dog Democrats as well as the Senators. Please let me know if you need this resent.

The Democratic National Party has targeted all of Texas and Congressman McCaul in particular. Note this quote from Congressman McCaul's Minutes: "As many of you know, I have decided to forgo the normal process of filing for reelection, which is to pay a fee. The Texas Election Code alternatively allows candidates to collect a certain number of signatures from registered voters in their district in order to show viability for their campaign. Items:

The usual snacks foods: nuts, jerky etc that fit in a pocket to take on patrol

Swiss Miss hot chocolate mix - add water type only

Chocolate candy bars and nicer chocolate candy

Canned fruit - with spoon

Microwave meals with spoon/fork & a MW safe bowl if needed

Special snack Christmas candies and foods

BBQ grill scrapers for use as mud/snow scrapers for boots

16 OZ stainless steel thermoses (no larger, this size fit in pockets) Cheap works as well as expensive

Hand/feet warmers

Fleece throws

Healthcare Reform Update

The Baucus Bill was approved by the Senate finance committee last week. One sole Republican senator supported the bill, Olympia Snowe from Maine. Though the bill does not contain a formal public option it does contain co-ops which in my opinion will lead to an ultimate public option and Government run healthcare.

Pelosi and Reid are now working late into the evenings to push their socialist agenda on the conservative democrats. Arms are being twisted.

We must "untwist" their arms. Below are the numbers that we need to continue to call. Please take the time to call these senators as many times as you can. Leave a message. Even if you cannot not get through just tying up the phone lines is helpful. Tell them that you are happy with the healthcare system in this country which does not need to be revamped. Tell them you demand health INSURANCE reform and tort reform.

This past week the Senate announced that it will consider S.1776 which would repeal and not replace the sustainable growth rate mechanism under Medicare. As you may know the SGR was created in 1997 to keep costs under control. It has not worked. Every year since 2004 it has required an act of Congress to prevent Medicare reimbursement cuts for physicians. This will happen again this year. If not, physicians will see a 21% cut at the end of the year. Physicians cannot practice medicine with such a dramatic cut in reimbursement.

Unfortunately the American Medical Association which represents only 17% of the doctors in this country are in support of this bill to fix the SGR problem. The bill is futile. It repeals but does not replace the SGR. This bill would freeze physician Medicare reimbursement rates with a 0% increase over the next decade. This bill would add over a quarter trillion dollars to the deficit with no offset. This bill does not include any medical liability reform.

As a physician I believe we deserve better than a one-sided repeal of the SGR. It needs to be placed with something sustainable and it must include tort reform. The national debt is already at 11.8 trillion dollars or over 38,000 per American.

Deficit spending steals from our children and grandchildren. We should instead be eliminating the \$300 billion of waste, fraud and abuse each year in the Federal Government.

Washington is clueless. They should not be involved in the business of medicine. Please call the numbers below to encourage these crucial players to leave our healthcare system in the hands of the physician and patient.
